

Working Group Meeting

- Referring to the Minister of MLSW Agreement No. 4999/MLSW dated 09 November 2022 on NRA Structure and Mandates.

- Referring to Q2 2023 workplan of Victim Assistance Unit.

NRA Victim Assisstance (VA) Unit organized quarterly VA TWG Meeting on 30 June 2023 at NRA office meeting room :

I. Objective

This activity will contribute to *Improved capacity of the NRA in strategic direction for the sector, supervision, data use and resource-mobilization including discourse on alternative financing modalities* for UXO Victim Assistance in Lao PDR.

More specifically, VA TWG will enable UXO stakeholders and concerned line ministries are invited to the meeting to seek for better coordination in providing UXO Victim Assistance.

Major agenda of this activity was as follows:

- Update the last TWG Meeting Minutes
- Presenting the achievement for Q2-2023 compared to the 9th NSEDP (# of victims VA unit shall support) and SPFIII targets (integration)
- Drafted Victim Assistance Report Forms
- Progress of Establishment of VA's Operator information management (IM) coordinators
- Establishment of Gender issue into UXO Sector
- Others

II. Participants

The meeting was chaired by Mr. Bounpheng Sisawath Deputy Director General of NRA and 36 participants (13 female, 36%) including by online participation of PRAs.

The participants include NRA staffs, Department of Planing and International Cooperation MLSW, Policy for The Devotees, Disability & The Elderly Department MLSW, International Organization Department MoFA, Skill Development Institute MLSW, Rehabilitation and Curative Department MoH, Center of Medical and Rehabilitation (CMR), Department of vocational development training Lao Youth Union, Skill Development Center Vientiane Capital LSW Department, Xiengkhaung PRA, Haouphan PRA, Laungprabang PRA, Bolikhamxay PRA, Khammaun PRA, Savannakhet PRA, Salavan PRA, Sekong PRA,

Champasak PRA and Attapue PRA, UNDP, KOICA-PIU, UXO Lao, Humanitarian Inclusion (HI), COPE, Norwegian's People Aid (NPA), World Education, Quality of Life Association, Lao Disable People Association.

III. Summary

The presentations are delivered to the VA TWG Meeting as followings:

1. Update the last TWG Meeting Minutes

- Coordination mechanism/system between NRA-VA and its implementing partners
 (IPs) and concerned ministries has hindered effective implementation and monitoring
 of VA activities. NRA VA will organize the UXO/Mine Victim Assistance Database
 Training workshop for UXO/Mine Victim Assistance Operators to ensure the
 standardized reporting forms are properly applied and VA Database Coordinators'
 TOR is drafted.
- Drafted VA Reporting Form

2. Presenting the achievement for Q1-2023 compared to the target of 9th Five Years NSEDP and SPFIII.

• VA Unit presented January to March 2023 achievement for the UXO VA. See the table below for detail:

• The accidents and victims' data collection to the end of the June 2023: 9 accidents occurred resulting in 19 victims (Seven boys injured, two men injured, three girls injured, three women injured and one boy died, two men died and one woman died).

3. NRA-VA Q2 2023 Work-Plan

NRA-VA Q3 2023 work-plan includes:

- Conducting one TWG Meetings.
- Conducting field monitoring and evaluation of coordination and data collection and reporting in Savannakhet, Xeingkhouang and Huaphan province provinces.
- Data collection for new accidents and victims.
- Conducting data collection and information management training workshop for concerned ministries, PRA and VA service providers.
- Oversight of VA-KOICA Project in Xiengkhouang and Huaphane province.
- Monitoring and follow up of VA's service providers' implementation of the project.
- Organizing the VA coordination meeting for district authorities, village chiefs, cluster villages chiefs and health centers.
- Leading Medias from China to visit Laungprabang and Xeingkhuoang province to interview the UXO survivors.

4. VA Operators' 2023 Annual Work-Plans

• Lao Youth Union (LYU)

Provided vocational training to 400 UXO survivors in XK and HP.

- 195 UXO victims or their family's members in Xeingkhouang (XK) province.
- 206 UXO victims or their families members in Houaphan province

• Quality of Life Association (QLA)

- Completed of the baseline survey on UXO Victim in XK and HP 599 victims were interviewed which 341 from Xeingkhouang province and 258 from Hauphan province and the final report will be submitted to NRA.
- Selected 480 UXO victims and their families who need livestock support 240 from Xeingkhouang province and 240 from Hauphan province.
- Provided peer to peer consultation training for 216 survivors, Community leaders and district and provincial authorities in Xeingkhouang and Hauphan provinces.
- Provide peer to peer activity to 12 survivors and their families.
- Provided advocacy activity in the community for rights of disabled people to 1,445 people from provincial, district, village authorities, and related organizations.
- Designed for remodeling or improving the environment for PWD such as individual evaluated the need assistance.

• World Education (WE)

- Provided support for the cost of the medical treatment fee and funeral support to the killed victim's family.
- Conducted field monitoring with NRA to follow up the UXO survivors if they still need more medical treatment.
- Produced WVMF posters, flipcharts and stickers.
